Concept

"VisitAble Housing" or "VisitAbility" is the concept of designing and building homes with basic accessibility. VisitAble homes provide easy access on the main level for all residents and visitors of all ages and mobility needs.



Features

VisitAble homes have three basic accessibility features:

- No-step entrance (at the front, back or side of the house).
- Wider doorways and clear passage on the main floor.
- A main floor bathroom (or powder room) that can be accessed by visitors who use mobility devices.

VisitAbility does not mean fully accessible or universal design. It does not apply to the upper floors or basement.

Benefits

- Easy access to the house and convenience within the house.
- Reduced risks of fall or injuries at home.
- Convenience for people with mobility issues, those with young children in strollers, those carrying large or heavy items.
- Reduced costs for home renovations when mobility changes occur.



Related Facts

- Most houses are built with barriers which cause inconvenience or limit access for homebuyers and visitors.
- In Canada, adults 65 or older will likely account for over 20% of the population by 2026.
- Over 50% of falls that older adults suffer occur in their own home.
- Older adults are more likely to age in their homes, rather than institutional settings if they have basic accessibility features.



Costs

- When VisitAbility features are planned at the outset, additional costs are minimal.
- Factors that affect the cost of building a VisitAble home are:
 - Topography land development for no-step entrance
 - Variations in prices between home builders
 - Local market conditions
