"VisitAble Housing" is the concept of designing and building homes with basic accessibility. VisitAble homes provide easy access on the main level for everyone.

VisitAble homes have three basic accessibility features:

1. No-step entrance (at the front, back or side of the house)
2. Wider doorways and clear passageways on the main floor
3. A main floor bathroom (or powder room) that can be accessed by visitors who use mobility devices
